selections from Ezekiel 1

As I looked, a stormy wind came out of the north: a great cloud with brightness around it and fire flashing forth continually....In the middle of it was something like four living creatures. This was their appearance: they were of human form. Each had four faces, and each of them had four wings. Their legs were straight...and they sparkled like burnished bronze.

And the four had their faces and their wings thus: their wings touched one another; each of them moved straight ahead without turning as they moved.

As for the appearance of their faces: the four had a face of a human being, the face of a lion..., the face of an ox..., and the face of an eagle....Their wings were spread out above....Each moved straight ahead; wherever the spirit would go, they went, without turning as they went.

In the middle of the living creatures there was something like burning coals of fire....the fire was bright, and lightning issued from the fire. The living creatures darted to and fro, like a flash of lightning.

As I looked at the living creatures, I saw a wheel on the earth beside the living creatures, one for each of them....Their appearance was like the gleaming of beryl...their construction being something like a wheel within a wheel....Their rims were tall and awesome, for the rims were full of eyes all around.

Wherever the spirit would go, they went, and the wheels rose along with them...for the spirit of the living creatures was in the wheels. When they moved, I hear the sound of their wings like the sound of mighty waters, like the thunder of the Almighty....And above the dome over their heads was something like a throne, in appearance like sapphire; and seated above the throne was something that seemed like a human form...and there was splendor all around.

This was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the LORD. When I saw it, I fell on my face...

Acts 9:1-19

Meanwhile Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' He asked, 'Who are you, Lord?' The reply came, 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do.' The men who were travelling with him stood speechless because they heard the voice but saw no one. Saul got up from the ground, and though his eyes were open, he could see nothing; so they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. For three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

Now there was a disciple in Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a vision, 'Ananias.' He answered, 'Here I am, Lord.' The Lord said to him, 'Get up and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul. At this moment he is praying, and he has seen in a vision a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him so that he might regain his sight.' But Ananias answered, 'Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much evil he has done to your saints in Jerusalem; and here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who invoke your name.' But the Lord said to him, 'Go, for he is an instrument whom I have chosen to bring my name before Gentiles and kings and before the people of Israel; I myself will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name.' So Ananias went and entered the house. He laid his hands on Saul and said, 'Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on your way here, has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.' And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and his sight was restored. Then he got up and was baptized, and after taking some food, he regained his strength.
