So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

**HELP FOR THE HELP MINISTRY** is needed. Our Churches United in Christ Help Ministry (CUICHM) helps families with utilities annually with money from our church budget and individual donations. Unfortunately, the bills that are usually presented are several hundreds of dollars and, due to our constricted funds, we are only able to help them with \$75-100 annually. Families receive a voucher for the amount of assistance made to the billing agency. This might prevent them from being disconnected for a time.

For January 2025 through July 2025, The Presbyterian Church assisted 107 families for a total \$11,783.80.
