Stewarding the Mysteries of Grace: Introducing Lilly Hunter

"Think of us this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God's mysteries." 1 Cor. 4.1

Fall leaves and pledge cards, oh my! Any long-standing church member is well aware that November is traditionally our time for stewardship and the dedication of our pledges. It is easy to just shrug off this act as just one more church custom and think, "nothing to see here; let's move on." But stewardship goes far beyond making your financial pledge. It is an opportunity to gaze deeply into the mystery of God and life! God created us in God's image to enjoy, behold, and care for life, life in all its dimensions: work and play, worship and prayer, exploration and learning, friendships and families, community and communion. Stewardship (and our pledges) is a practical, concrete way to say, "All life is gift! I want to give back."

Sure, our finances can be reduced to a line-item budget and a finance report. But the reduction hides the reality: We are stewarding God's mysteries of grace. If you look closely at a finance report you will see the manifold reality of grace! Grace as help to the homeless, grace as learning, grace as belonging and fellowship, grace as worship, grace as new hope, a fresh start, and the deep, deep love of God in Christ. And maybe most of all: grace as the people we share life with!

So let me introduce you to someone your generous financial gifts have made possible: our new Director of Student Ministries Lilly Hunter! Lilly joins our staff on November 16, when we will introduce her to the congregation in worship. After over a year working to draft, craft, pray, and plan for this position which will share the "mysteries of grace" with our students, the Youth Council met Lilly and were soon excited to offer her the position.

Lilly has been serving as a full-time student minister since 2020. As she puts it, "I could not be more enamored with seeing teenagers and young adults come to know and love Jesus Christ." She is excited to become part of our community here at the Presbyterian Church along with her family (which includes husband, Colton, foster son Jay, age 18, Cora, age 2 1/2, and Willow, age 8 months). Colton works as the general manager of Simplot Grower Solutions in Woodburn, and when the two of them are not working they also farm row crops and raise cattle (their "farming hobby" as Lilly puts it). Lilly also enjoy pottery, reading, and riding a Harley Sportster.

Lilly is definitely a people person! As a student minister she has a heart for disciplining students. As she describes it, her days spent with students "are simply the launching point for engaging their lives. Discipleship means to walk with, and that means walking with them through family crisis, sickness, sports, school events, and much more. [I look forward to meeting them] where they are and allow Christ to create inroads for the Gospel through genuine relationships." Don't look for Lilly to be doing this ministry all by herself. She believes in the ministry of the whole church using their Godgiven gifts. She envisions students learning and growing alongside others: "Beyond teaching [students] in a way that engages both their head and their heart, the greatest way that they become followers of Jesus is through relationships with older, wiser believers. I look forward to facilitating discipleship relationships and working to create an intergenerational investment in teens and young adults so that they are able to follow others as they follow Jesus."

Indeed, each student, each follower of Christ here at the Presbyterian Church is one of God's beloved mysteries worthy of our stewardship, that is, worthy of our love, enjoyment, and care. Join me in welcoming Lilly Hunter to our church and join me in being stewards of God's amazing grace.



Wayne, a retired physician, and Sharon, a retired teaching nurse, bring their lifetime of practical compassion to their roles as volunteers. They have shared meals and conversations with our guests; Sharon believes their lives in health care prepared them to be good cooks because of their attention to detail. Besides volunteering as a innkeeper, Sharon, a new deacon on our deacon board as well, took a step of faith last year


when she volunteered to be one of our church van drivers who goes to pick up the guests as the beginning of the night.

sign-up sheet next to the DRITI sign-up sheets on the landing next to the chapel and sign up soon!


GENERAL CHURCH HOUSEKEEPING RULES
